Apple farming in Nova Scotia


- The Spriggs led a privileged life in England. They were industrious, prosperous Quakers, they were part owners of a mattress factory and they lived in a spacious home with servants
- Concerns about a vocation for Bob (he had lost an eye) led to a
 decision to forego their life in England and immigrate to
 Canada where Bob could engage in farming (a family story
 anyway)
- And so they came to Canada in 1914 and purchased an apple farm near the little village of Port Williams at the mouth of the Cornwallis River (on Starrs Point Road, named after their neighbour, the Starrs)...

Apple farming in Nova Scotia

- The timing was poor, however. With the outbreak of war, the apple market vanished and William and Alice were forced, in time, to sell Edgemere at fire-sale prices.
- Fortunately, they were financially independent and retired to to St Anne de Bellevue near Montreal and a comfortable, quiet life. Bob became an engineer!




